Deck the Table Placemats

Designed by Corey Yoder

Finished Placemat size: 14" x 19"

Ingredients

1 Charm Pack for pieced border

1 yard White Fabric for embroidered center and appliqued borders

3/4 yard Black Fabric for skinny border, applique, and binding

7/8 yard Print Fabric for backing

1/4 yard Heat n Bond Lite

4 pieces of batting 15" x 20"

thread to match applique fabric

water erasable fabric marker

coordinating size 8 Perle Cotton

embroidery hoop

temporary fabric spray adhesive

Cutting

Charm Pack fabrics

Cut 14 charm pack squares into 4 squares 2 1/2"

White Fabric

Cut 2 strips 14 1/2" x WOF, subcut into 4 rectangles 9 1/2" x 14 1/2" and 8 rectangles 3" x 14 1/2"

Black Fabric

Cut 4 strips 1" x WOF, subcut into 8 rectangles 1" x 14 1/2"

Cut 8 strips 2 1/4" x WOF for binding, use 2 strips per placemat

Set aside the remainder of the black to be used for appliqued borders

Backing Fabric

Cut in half twice to make 4 rectangles approximately 15 3/4" x 20"

Construction

Note: All seam allowances are 1/4".

- 1. Sew together (7) 2 1/2" squares. Press seams to one side. Make 8 units.
- 2. Sew a 1" x 14 1/2" skinny border strip to the left and right of a 9 1/2" x 14 1/2" center rectangle. Press seams away from the center. Make 4 units.
- 3. Sew a white 3" x 14 1/2" rectangle onto each skinny border strip. Press seams toward the skinny border.
- 4. Sew a pieced block section made in step 1 onto the left and right of the unit made in step 3. Press seams towards the pieced block section.

Applique the Borders

- 1. Choose and size desired fonts(Microsoft Word is a great program to use). Trace the reverse of the letters onto the Heat n Bond Lite.
- 2. Cut out each letter approximately 1/8" from the traced edge.
- 3. Fuse all letters onto the wrong side of the applique fabric.
- 4. Cut out each letter on the traced line.
- 5. Center the letters in the white border portion of each placemat and fuse in place.
- 6. Finish each letter with a blanket stitch.

Embroidering the Blocks

- 1. Use a water erasable marker to trace the embroidery pattern onto the center of each placemat.
- 2. Hoop the placemat and embroider using one strand of Perle Cotton.

The embroideries can be completed using a back stitch and french knots.

Quilting and Finishing

- 1.Sandwich each placemat/batting/backing.
- 2. Spray baste and quilt as desired.
- 3. Bind each placemat.
